Turn it on & off

To turn your phone on or off, press and hold End [ৰ].



Activate SIM cards

Your phone supports two SIM cards. When two SIM cards are installed, you can activate one or both SIM cards.

- 1 From the home screen, press Menu (left soft key) to open the main menu.
- 2 Select ♥ Settings > Dual SIM settings.
- 3 Set mode to Dual SIM open, Only SIM1 open, Only SIM2 open or Flight mode.

Note: If only one SIM card is installed, it will be activated by default.

Make & answer calls

To make a call from the home screen, enter a number and press Call .

Note: If the **Dual SIM open** mode is activated, choose which SIM card to use.

To answer a call, press Call $\ \ \Box$. To turn off the incoming call alert, press **Reject**.

To end a call, press End 🧻.

Surf the Web for cool content and more. See "Web" on page 17. An optional microSD memory card can be installed in your phone—you can load it up with photos, videos and music from your computer.

Menu navigation

1 From the home screen, press Menu (left soft key) to open the main menu.



Tip: You can also press • to open the main menu

- 2 Press pup, down, left or right to scroll and highlight a menu option.
- 3 Press to select the highlighted option.





Shortcut keys

From the home screen press the navigation key up, down, left or right to quickly open **Media player**, **Alarm**, **User profiles** or **Tone settings**.

To change your shortcut keys press \bigcirc > \diamondsuit Settings > Phone settings > Dedicated key.

Adjust volume

Press the volume keys on the side of your phone to change the ring volume (in the home screen), or the earpiece volume (during a call).

Home screen

Quick start: home screen

The home screen gives you all your latest information in one place. It's what you see when you turn on the phone or press End [a] from a menu. It's basically like this:



Note: Your home screen might look a little different.

Main menu

All the apps on your phone are shown in your *main menu*.

To open the main menu, from the home screen, press **Menu** (left soft key). Press (up, down, left or right to highlight a menu option, then press to select the highlighted option. You can press End (to return to the home screen at any time.

The status bar at the top of the screen contains icons that tell you about messages and phone status.

Calls

In-call options

During a call, press **Options** to hold, end or make a new call, and more. Press **Mute** to mute your call. Press to turn the loudspeaker on and press again to turn the loudspeaker off.

Note: If two SIM cards are installed, choose which you want to use.

Redial

- 1 Press > Call center > Call history Note: If two SIM cards are installed, choose which you want to use.
- 2 Highlight the history you want to use (SIM1 call history or SIM2 call history) and press
- 3 Highlight the contact you want to call and press Call [].

Save a contact

- 1 Enter a number in the home screen.
- 2 Press Options > Save to Phonebook > Add new contact or Replace existing.
- 3 Enter contact details and press Done, then Yes.

Emergency calls

Note: Your service provider programmes one or more emergency phone numbers (such as 999 or 110) that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked. Emergency numbers vary by country. Your pre-programmed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental or interference issues.



Receive a message

When you receive a message, your phone plays an alert and shows the new message indicator \bowtie at the top of the screen.

To read the new message, press View.

To read messages stored in your inbox, press Messaging > Inbox.

Turn Bluetooth power on or off

When Bluetooth power is on, the Bluetooth indicator **(*)** appears in the home screen.

Note: To extend battery life, turn off Bluetooth power when not in use.

Connect new devices

To connect with a new device, you need to pair with it. You only need to do this once for each device—to connect again, see "Reconnect devices" on page 19.

- 1 Make sure the device you are pairing with is in discoverable mode (see device instructions).
- 2 Press > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth > Search audio device.

Note: If Bluetooth power is not turned on, your phone will ask if you want to **Power on Bluetooth first?** Press **Yes**.

3 Your phone lists the devices it finds within range. Highlight a device and press (a) to connect. 4 If necessary, enter the device passkey (like 0000) to connect to the device.

Tip: For specific information about a device, check the instructions that came with it. For more Bluetooth support, go to www.motorola.com/Bluetoothsupport.

For maximum Bluetooth security, always connect Bluetooth devices in a safe, private environment.

Note: Using a mobile device or accessory while driving may cause distraction and may be illegal. Always obey the local laws and drive safely.

To view your calendar in different ways press Options > Jump to date or Go to weekly view.

Add calendar events

From any calendar view, press Options > Add event > Reminder, Meeting or Course. Enter event details and press Options > Done > Yes.

Edit calendar events

To edit an event, press **Options** > **View** > **Options** > **Edit**. Edit event details and when you've finished, press **Options** > **Done** > **Yes**.

Tasks

To add a task, press Add > Date, Call or Anniversary.

Alarm

Find it: 🛑 > 5 Organiser > Alarm

To turn on an alarm, highlight it and press , scroll to **On** and press **Done** > **Yes**.

When an alarm sounds, press **Stop** to turn it off or **Snooze** to delay.

To set a snooze period, highlight the alarm, then press **Edit** > **Snooze** (min).

To set FM radio as your alarm, highlight the alarm, then press **Edit** > **Alarm tone** > **FM radio**.

World clock

See the current time in cities around the world.

To set the clock to allow for daylight saving time, press **Options** > **Daylight saving time for foreign city** > **On** or **Off**.

Calculator & currency converter

Just scroll and select to open the **Calculator** or **Currency converter**.

File manager

Find it: 🗭 > 📝 File manager

Highlight **Phone** or **Memory card** and press **to** view your folders. Press **Options** to **Open**, create **New folder**, **Rename**, **Delete** and more.

Your phone has different profiles. You can customise ringtones, alerts and volumes for each profile.

You can select these profiles:

- General: Standard profile default setting.
- Outdoor: Ringtone and key tone volume set to maximum
- Indoor: Vibrate is off, ringtone is on.
- · Vibration: Vibrate is on, ringtone is off.
- Headset: Adjust settings for when a wired headset is plugged into your phone.
- Bluetooth: Adjust settings for when a Bluetooth headset is connected to your phone.

To change a profile's settings, press Options

- > Customise. You can adjust these settings:
- Tone settings: Set the ringtones of incoming calls and messages (for each SIM card), key tones and other events.
- Volume: Set the volume of ringtones and key tones.

- Alert type: Set to Ring only, Vib. only, Vib. and ring, Vib. then ring and Silent.
- Ring type: Set to Single, Repeat, Ascending.
- Extra tone: Play an extra tone for Warning, Error, Camp on or Connect.
- Answer mode: Set to Any key to answer calls by pressing any key.

To set display settings such as wallpaper and screen saver, press **(●)** > **♥** Settings > Phone settings > Display.

- Insert symbol: Select a symbol to insert.

To delete letters to the left of the cursor, press Back \subset .



To take the photo, press Camera or . Your photo is shown in the viewfinder.

Press the left soft key, then:

- To edit the photo, select Photo editor.

 To delete the photo and return to the viewfinder, select Delete.

To see photos you've taken, go to the camera viewfinder screen and press the left soft key then Switch to > Photo album.

To record a video, go to the camera viewfinder screen and press the left soft key then **Switch to** > **Video recorder**.



Codes & passwords

Your phone password is originally set to **1234**. If your service provider didn't change the phone password, you should change it:

Find it: ■ > ☼ Settings > Security settings > SIM1/SIM2 security settings > Change password

You can also change your SIM card **PIN** and **PIN2** codes.

If you forget your phone password: At the Input password prompt, try entering 1234 or the last four digits of your phone number. If that doesn't work, contact your service provider.

If you forget other codes: If you forget your SIM PIN or PIN2, contact your service provider.

Lock keypad

You can lock your phone's keypad and keys to prevent unwanted phone operations.

Your phone automatically locks the keypad and keys when no activity is detected for the specified interval.

Crash recovery

In the unlikely event that your phone stops responding to key presses, try a quick reset. Remove the back cover and battery ("Assemble & charge" on page 4), then replace and turn on your phone as usual.

Reset

Reset default factory settings on your phone.

Caution: This option erases all information you have entered (including contacts and calendar entries) and content you have downloaded (including pictures, videos and music files) stored in your phone's memory. After you erase the information, you can't recover it. This option does not delete SIM card or memory card information.

Safety, regulatory & legal

Battery use & safety

Important: Handle and store batteries properly to avoid injury or damage. Most battery issues arise from improper handling of batteries, and particularly from the continued use of damaged batteries.

DON'Ts

- Don't disassemble, crush, puncture, shred or otherwise attempt to change the form of your battery.
- Don't let the mobile device or battery come in contact with water.* Water can get into the mobile device's circuits, leading to corrosion. If the mobile device and/or battery get wet, have them checked by your service provider or contact Motorola, even if they appear to be working properly.*
- Don't allow the battery to touch metal objects. If metal objects, such as jewellery, stay in prolonged contact with the battery contact points, the battery could become very hot.
- Don't place your mobile device or battery near a heat source.*
 Excessive heat can damage the mobile device or the battery.
 High temperatures can cause the battery to swell, leak or
 malfunction. Therefore:
- Don't dry a wet or damp battery with an appliance or heat source, such as a hairdryer or microwave oven.

DOs

- Do avoid leaving your mobile device in your car in high temperatures.*
- Do avoid dropping the battery or mobile device.* Dropping these items, especially on a hard surface, can potentially cause damage.*

- Do contact your service provider or Motorola if your mobile device or battery has been damaged from dropping or high temperatures.
- * Note: Always make sure that the battery compartment is closed and secure to avoid direct exposure of the battery to any of these conditions.

Important: Use Motorola Original products for quality assurance and safeguards. To assist consumers in differentiating authentic Motorola batteries from non-original or counterfeit batteries (that may not have adequate safety protection), Motorola provides holograms on its batteries. Consumers should confirm that any battery that they purchase has a "Motorola Original" hologram. Motorola recommends that you always use Motorola-branded batteries and chargers. Motorola mobile devices are designed to work with Motorola batteries. If you see a message on your display such as Invalid Battery or Unable to Charge, take the following steps:

- Remove the battery and inspect it to confirm that it has a "Motorola Original" hologram;
- · If there is no hologram, the battery is not a Motorola battery;
- If there is a hologram, replace the battery and try charging it again;
- If the message remains, contact a Motorola authorised service centre.

Important: Motorola's warranty does not cover damage to the mobile device caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.

Warning: Use of a non-Motorola battery or charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage or other hazard.

Proper and safe battery disposal and recycling: Proper battery disposal is not only important for safety, it benefits the environment. Consumers may recycle their used batteries in many retail or service provider locations. Additional information on proper disposal and recycling may be found on the web:

Battery Charging

Notes for charging your product's battery:

- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.
 Never expose batteries to temperatures below 0°C (32°F) or above 45°C (113°F) when charging.
- · New batteries are not fully charged.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- Motorola batteries and charging systems have circuitry that protects the battery against damage from overcharging.

Driving Precautions

Responsible and safe driving is your primary responsibility when behind the wheel of a vehicle. Using a mobile device or accessory for a call or other application while driving may cause distraction. Using a mobile device or accessory may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas, always obey the laws and regulations on the use of these products.

While driving, NEVER:

- Type or read texts.
- · Enter or review written data.
- · Surf the web.
- · Input navigation information.
- Perform any other functions that divert your attention from driving.

While driving, ALWAYS:

- · Keep your eyes on the road.
- Use a hands-free device if available or required by law in your area.
- Enter destination information into a navigation device before driving.
- Use voice-activated features (such as voice dial) and speaking features (such as audible directions), if available.
- Obey all local laws and regulations for the use of mobile devices and accessories in the vehicle.
- End your call or other task if you cannot concentrate on driving.

Seizures/Blackouts

Some people may be susceptible to epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, such as when playing videos or games. These may occur even if a person has never had a previous seizure or blackout.

If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult with your doctor before playing videos or games or enabling a flashing lights feature (if available) on your mobile device.

Discontinue use and consult a doctor if any of the following symptoms occur: convulsion, eye or muscle twitching, loss of awareness, involuntary movements or disorientation. It is always a good idea to hold the screen away from your eyes, leave the lights on in the room, take a 15-minute break every hour and stop use if you are tired.

Caution About High Volume Usage

Warning: Exposure to loud noise from any source for extended periods of time may affect your hearing. The



louder the volume sound level, the less time is required before your hearing could be affected. To protect your hearing:

- Limit the amount of time that you use headsets or headphones at high volume.
- Avoid turning up the volume to block out noisy surroundings.
- Turn the volume down if you can't hear people speaking near you.

If you experience hearing discomfort, including the sensation of pressure or fullness in your ears, ringing in your ears or muffled speech, you should stop listening to the device through your headset or headphones and have your hearing checked. Repetitive Motion

When you repetitively perform actions such as pressing keys or entering finger-written characters, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, arms, shoulders, neck or other parts of your body. If you continue to have discomfort during or after such use, stop use and see a doctor. [Nov0109]

Small Children

Keep your mobile device and its accessories away from small children. These products are not toys and may be hazardous to small children. For example:

- A choking hazard may exist for small, detachable parts.
- Improper use could result in loud sounds, possibly causing hearing injury.
- · Improperly handled batteries could overheat and cause a burn.

Glass Parts

Some parts of your mobile device may be made of glass. This glass could break if the product is dropped on a hard surface or receives a substantial impact. If glass breaks, do not touch or attempt to remove it. Stop using your mobile device until the glass has been replaced by a qualified service centre.

Operational Warnings

Obey all posted signs when using mobile devices in public areas.

Potentially Explosive Atmospheres

Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres are often, but not always, posted and can include fuelling areas, such as below does on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities or areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain dust or metal powders.

When you are in such an area, turn off your mobile device, and do not remove, install or charge batteries. In such areas, sparks can occur and cause an explosion or fire.

Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

Exposure to RF Energy

Your mobile device contains a transmitter and receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your mobile device, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your mobile device transmits.

Your mobile device is designed to comply with local regulatory requirements in your country concerning exposure of human beings to RF energy.

RF Energy Operational Precautions

For optimal mobile device performance, and to ensure that human exposure to RF energy does not exceed the guidelines set forth in the relevant standards, always follow these instructions and precautions:

 When placing or receiving a phone call, hold your mobile device just like you would a landline phone.

- If you wear the mobile device on your body, always place the mobile device in a Motorola-supplied or approved clip, holder, holster, case or body harness. If you do not use a body-worn accessory supplied or approved by Motorola, keep the mobile device and its antenna at least 2.5 centimeters (1 inch) from your body when transmitting.
- Úsing accessories not supplied or approved by Motorola may cause your mobile device to exceed RF energy exposure guidelines. For a list of Motorola-supplied or approved accessories, visit our website at: www.motorola.com.

RF Energy Interference/Compatibility

Nearly every electronic device is subject to RF energy interference from external sources if inadequately shielded, designed or otherwise configured for RF energy compatibility. In some circumstances, your mobile device may cause interference with other devices.

Follow Instructions to Avoid Interference Problems

Turn off your mobile device in any location where posted notices instruct you to do so.

In an aircraft, turn off your mobile device whenever instructed to do so by airline staff. If your mobile device offers a flight mode or similar feature, consult airline staff about using it in flight.

Implantable Medical Devices

If you have an implantable medical device, such as a pacemaker or defibrillator, consult your doctor before using this mobile device.

Persons with implantable medical devices should observe the following precautions:

- ALWAYS keep the mobile device more than 20 centimeters (8 inches) from the implantable medical device when the mobile device is turned ON.
- · DO NOT carry the mobile device in a breast pocket.

- Use the ear opposite the implantable medical device to minimise the potential for interference.
- Turn OFF the mobile device immediately if you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place.

Read and follow the directions from the manufacturer of your implantable medical device. If you have any questions about using your mobile device with your implantable medical device, consult your healthcare provider.

Specific Absorption Rate (ICNIRP)

Your model wireless phone meets international quidelines for exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed to not exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organisation ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to assure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health, and to account for any variations in measurements.

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The ICNIRP SAR limit for mobile devices used by the general public is 2 watts per kilogram (W/kg), and the highest SAR value for this mobile device when tested at the ear is 0.684 W/kg. As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in this guide. In this case, the highest tested SAR value is 0.893 W/kg. The tests are carried out in accordance with international guidelines for testing. The SAR information includes the Motorola testing protocol, assessment procedure and measurement uncertainty range for this product.

As SAR is measured utilising the mobile device's highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this mobile device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to

automatic changes to the power level of the mobile device to ensure that it only uses the minimum level required to reach the network.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various mobile devices and at various positions, they meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure.
